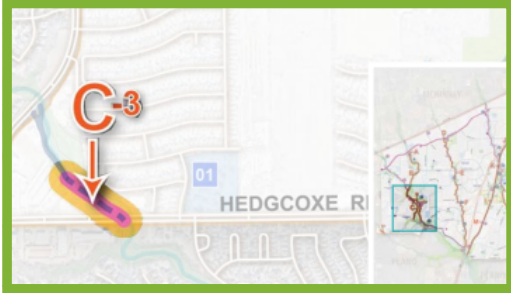


Trail Development

RUSSELL BRANCH | EUGENE MCDERMOTT TRAILHEAD | ROWLETT | CELEBRATION PASS | WATTERS | COTTONWOOD - DOWNTOWN



RUSSELL BRANCH

The segment will serve as a continuation of the Russell Creek Greenbelt trail located in Plano, ending at Hedgcoxe Rd (the City of Allen and Plano border).

EUGENE MCDERMOTT TRAILHEAD

The Eugene McDermott Trailhead is currently in design. The trailhead will be unlike other traditional trailheads as it will serve as a welcome destination for the greater Eugene McDermott Park. Currently the project is in phase 1. It will provide the following amenities: a 50 space parking lot, storm detention area to capture runoff from a rainfall during a storm event, trail connections to Rowlett Trail, plaza area.



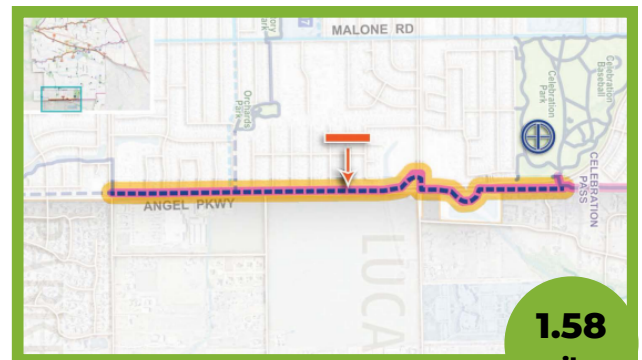

ROWLETT

The Rowlett Trail Extension has been much requested by residents. As a part of the Collin County Regional Trails plan and Regional Veloweb it will connect to Watters Trail, which connects to The Bluebonnet Trail (Plano). This has allowed the award of 3.5 million dollars in grant funding for this project. The north portion and south portion of trail are currently under design. The 1.34 miles are for portions of trail not covered in the grant.

CELEBRATION PASS

Allen's Celebration Trail. The trail segment will stretch 1.58mi and begin at Angel Parkway, connecting to the existing 12ft wide existing trail. This segment will fill in an important trail gap while providing continuous connectivity along eastern Allen, from Celebration Park to the nearby neighborhoods to the south.

WATTERS

The proposed Watters Trail extension from Watters Commercial has been identified on the trail master plan as a vital connection. The proposed trail will intersect and connect with the future Rowlett Trail. Currently we are seeking a proposal for trail design. The trail will be approximately 0.25mi in length. The trail program items include a new pedestrian bridge, historic marker, and hike/bike trail improvements, with potential boardwalk or elevated trail.
